- 2012 Joint award PhD Faculty of Medicine (Biomedical Sciences and Biotechnology)
- 2018 Renewed and expanded. Dual award PhD programme with the Faculty of Science in Bioinformatics and Biotechnology (TNE award from the British Council).
- 2023 Renewed and expanded: All departments in Health and Life Sciences (Liverpool) + Pharmaceutical Sci, All departments in Faculty of Science at Chula
- Engineering and Veterinary Sciences in discussion





What does partnership involve?

But also:

Active **student exchange**:

Liverpool Biology (25/year) and Chemistry (30/year) students spend time at Chulalongkorn

6 weeks or 9 months as part of their Masters or Bachelors programme (Liverpool credits)

Develops Key Employability and Global Citizen Skills

Chula does not charge tuition fee to incoming Liverpool students

Liverpool does not charge tuition fee for incoming Chula PhD students

And Staff exchange

Liverpool Staff provide week long workshops in Bioinformatics

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
Aims of the workshops

- To develop and acquire a range of personal and interpersonal skills relating to effective self-management, self-learning and reflection, and working relationships with others;
- To develop and acquire an enhanced ability to communicate effectively in academic and professional settings via different formats and to different audiences;
- To develop and acquire skills and knowledge required for enhanced employability;
- To develop and acquire a range of skills that will help with research planning and delivery to professional standards.

Delivery

A combination of instructional sessions, student interactions and engagement, and opportunities for students to reflect on and modify their own work

and joint research publications and grants

Benefits to both partners

- International experience for Chula and Liverpool students
- Enhanced research partnerships/facilities for staff
- Joint publications and grants
- Shared teaching
- Chula students often return as Faculty
